






Digital agenda vs. bureaucracy





Consciously navigate the concepts of e-signatures

Electronic signature or e-signature Digital signature Simple/standard electronic signature (SES) Advanced electronic signature (AES) Qualified electronic signature (QES) Electronic time stamp The eIDAS Regulation



Common findings for the use of e-signatures

Businesses can use e-signatures to sign different types of contracts.

However, it varies from country to country as to what type of electronic signature has legal effect, whether documents signed with different types of e-signatures qualify as written statements, and which type of contracts must be concluded in a written form.



E-signatures on examples - commercial contracts in comparison

This chart shows a comparison between nine CEE countries on the issue of whether the following types of electronic signatures are acceptable in commercial contracts where the law requires a written form.

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




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
