

Cultural Anthropology

Anthropology is the study of people and culture.

Culture is the shared system of meanings, symbols, rituals, and practices of an organization or society.

The **culture** and **structure** of **work** shapes and constrains the thoughts and behaviors of workers.

An anthropological approach can help businesses understand the organizational & cultural shifts that are demanded in the expanded eco-system of physical and virtual workplaces – how people will work, collaborate & relate to each other.

- Communicate new guidelines & protocols and launch a mobility ambassador program
- Leverage technology & architectural design techniques
- Provide mental, social, and financial health support

- Create intentional touchpoints and fostering spontaneous interactions
- Develop new workplace rituals that bond workers.
- Relaunch training to build a DEI culture.
- Organize conversations on how to create workplaces and experiences that reflect the values of anti-racism, gender equity, and social justice


